William Mundo



Meeting William Mundo today you wouldn't imagine that two years ago he wanted to quit going to his high school classes and work toward his GED. Today, 17 year old Mundo is an honor student juggling a full load of classes at Lake County High School while taking 10 credits at Colorado Mountain College, playing football and working a part time job as a lifeguard at the aquatic center. When he is not working, studying or at practice, William is working hard on completing scholarship applications for college. He hopes to go to the University of Colorado and earn a master's degree from CU's School of Medicine. William will be the first in his family to go to college.

When asked what turned him around with school, William credits assistant professor Kelli McCall and Allen Burch, coordinator of Upward Bound – a CMC program William participated in that introduces 9th and 10th graders to college.

“Mr. Burch and Ms. McCall inspired me to take classes at CMC,” said William. “College is not at all what I expected – it’s fun. The instructors are really awesome and friendly.”

William is one of 84 Lake County, Buena Vista and Salida High School students currently taking CMC courses while also earning high school credit through the dual enrollment program. When William graduates from high school in May, he will have completed more

than one year of college credit.

“The program is a great opportunity for students to save money. I think everyone should take advantage of it,” said William.

Attending CMC has given William the confidence to pursue his educational goals. He said, “I think that going right to a big university would be really rough.”

The workload can be overwhelming at times but William knows he must work hard for good grades to get the scholarships he needs to continue his college education. “Mary Martin [Learning Access Center tutor] has been the biggest help. She helps me stay on-top of my work,” said William.

This summer, William plans to get his EMT certification through CMC. He said, “I want to have a decent job to help me get through college.”


